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FILM 1 THE WAITING ROOM

Joanne has a mild learning disability and lives on her own. She is not eligible for social care support. She has anxiety and depression and has had support from mental health services in the past.

FILM 2 IT'S MY BODY

Emma lives with her carer. Together they go to see the GP. She has some questions she would like to ask the GP about her relationship with her boyfriend.

FILM 3 ON THE WARD

Steve is having a planned operation. His support worker comes with him to the hospital but then leaves as Steve is only eligible for a few hours support a week. Steve has to wait for several hours for his operation. After being discharged he goes to collect his medication.

FILM 4 INCLUDE ME

Eddie has profound and multiple learning disabilities. He communicates through hand gestures and body language. In this film we show ambulance and nursing staff really listening to Eddie and his Mum and making plans for reasonable adjustments.
