
Summary of changes in the Council's Learning Disability budget 2025 - 2026



Brighton and Hove City Council makes a budget each year to decide how to spend the money available to them.



For 2025 - 2026 the Council needs to save £17 million. In total, Adult Social Care services have to save £9 million.



The main change proposed for Learning Disability Services is for the Council to find someone else to run 4 Accomodation and Support services (homes):



- Burwash Lodge
- Leicester Villas
- Preseton Drove
- Windlesham Road



There are 18 people living in these homes.



The Council proposes to get other providers to run the homes instead of them. They think this will save the Council £400,000.



The people who are living there currently will not be asked to move. The new provider will be required to keep the same staff too.



The people who are living at these homes currently will get a Care Act Review to make sure they continue to have their needs met.



They will also get a chance to have their views and opinions about the changes heard.



If Councillors agree to make this change, the process will take about 6 months.



There are other more general changes planned for Adult Social Care services, but these will not impact Learning Disability services directly.
